There is a number of girls that were kidnapped who belong to Girls' Brigade. We encourage you to read these articles, pray for their release, and pray for their families. 150 days: Pray for Chibok girls.

#bringbackourgirls background

11 September 2014 marks 150 days since over 200 Chibok school girls in Nigeria were abducted - 150 days without love and family; 150 days without freedom of choice.

What happened to the Chibok school girls?

In the middle of the night on 14-15 April 2014, a group of militants from Boko Haram forced their way into a Christian boarding school and kidnapped nearly 250 young women, aged 16 – 18. Although the area was increasingly unsafe and the school had been officially closed for a month, these young women were called back to undertake their senior certificate exam in physics. Currently there are around 180 girls still missing (though there may be more). Some young women managed to escape, others were killed. We believe that a small number of the girls were members of Girls' Brigade.

Who is Boko Haram?

Nigeria ranks number one on Open Door's World Watch Top Ten Violence list. The country is spilt into two; the Muslim north and the Christian south and there has been increasingly high levels of violence and persecution against Christians. Boko Haram, a radical Islamic terrorist group, has been terrorizing north eastern Nigeria - a region that's half Muslim and half Christian - for almost five years with the goal of establishing an Islamic state. They're ideologically opposed to Western culture, as well as the education of girls, and thus co-ordinated the kidnapping. Boko Haram has demanded ransoms and release of terrorist prisoners in exchange for the girls. There is a serious concern that these girls will be sold into forced marriage, slavery or even killed.

What is being done to help then?

Although the kidnappings went unreported for two weeks, a successful #bringbackourgirls online campaign went viral. But now it has been 150 days and the media has gone silent. Who is giving these voiceless girls a voice? Although it's a complicated political situation, it's also unclear what the Nigerian government is doing to help the victims, which is why activists in the African country have been holding daily protests and taking to social media.

Why does GB care?

Girls' Brigade cares for girls because God cares for girls. We believe in hope for the Chibok girls. We believe that God calls us to build the hope-filled Gospel alternative by modelling His transformative and restorative heart.

What you need to complete this craft

* A plain canvas (any size)

*PVA Glue


*Acrylic Paint (any colour)

*Paint brushes

*Sketching Pencils

*A Bible verse, a quote or design

What you need to do is get a plain canvas you can paint it with a base coat if you want but it is not necessary. Sketch a design or some words onto the canvas (you could write your favourite Bible down), then get some plain PVA glue (make sure it's not too runny). Carefully squirt the PVA onto the design/words you have sketched onto the



Once the glue is dry you can paint over the canvas with a top coat, this can be any colour.

Let that dry and then voila you have a really simple but beautiful gift or piece of art for yourself.



The Secret to unfading beauty

"Hey mom, can I buy this mascara?" "Can I get this lip gloss? I'll use my own money. Pleeeease? "Will you ever let me wear makeup? When I was thirteen, these were the questions I pestered my mother with constantly. After reading teen magazines, I was convinced that makeup was what I needed to be beautiful. Just a little mascara, a bit of blush, and a dab of lip gloss and I would be able to look like the models on the glossy pages I read over and over. A few cosmetics were all I needed to make everyone at school like me—to make me like me. Plenty of products Judging by the thousands of beauty products available, I'm not the only one who has ever had those thoughts. During a quick trip to the drug store today, I stopped to browse in the makeup aisle. I was astounded by the number of mascaras available for sale. Under the Maybelline sign alone I counted twelve different colorful tubes of the stuff. Almay had five. Cover Girl had thirteen. In all, I found 73 unique products guaranteed to enhance my eyelashes!

That doesn't even take into account all of the other items offered in the cosmetic aisle. We can buy products to make our cheeks appear rosier, our eyebrows darker, and our lips shinier. Thousands of choices are available to buff up our appearance—our physical beauty. True beauty is inside

When I looked up and down all the aisles of the store, I couldn't find any products to help me enhance my inner beauty. I didn't see any gels or lotions to help me develop a beautiful heart. Which is sad, because that's the kind of beauty God wants us to have.

In the book of 1 Peter, He tells us: "Your beauty should not come from outward adornment, such as braided hair and the wearing of gold jewellery and fine clothes. Instead, it should be that of your inner self, the unfading beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is of great worth in God's sight."

1 Peter 3:3-4 Now I don't think that Peter was telling these women that it was wrong to fix their hair or wear cute clothes. He isn't saying we shouldn't wear makeup or put on a necklace. I think he was telling them, telling us, that the latest hairstyle or the trendiest wardrobe isn't what makes a girl lovely. True beauty comes from inside.

God tells us that instead of 73 tubes of mascara, instead of hundreds of cosmetics, there is only one thing we need to be truly beautiful: a gentle and quiet spirit. What does a gentle and quiet spirit look like? You'll be relieved to know that a gentle spirit doesn't mean being a timid, pathetic person. A quiet spirit doesn't mean we have to sit in a corner all day never talking to our friends.

The word used for gentle in 1 Peter 3 means having a graceful soul. If we could buy a jar of cream that could give a gentle spirit, it would enable us to accept what God is doing in our lives. It would help us to trust that God knows what He is doing, even when we can't make any sense out of it at all. The word quiet in this passage describes a peaceful heart that is not upset by chaotic circumstances. A bottle of this kind of quiet gives a tranquillity that isn't dependent on having a perfect day. It's like the one person who manages to remain calm and clean during a cafeteria food fight. Where will you find true beauty?

Although there aren't any products available in the cosmetics aisle to give us a gentle and quiet heart we don't have to lose hope. God is more than willing to give us the grace we need to be able to hold His hand in trust when we start to question what's happening in our lives. He gives us His Spirit to quiet down our chaotic hearts.

I think our heavenly Father seriously wonders why we expect bottles of liquids and tubes of gels to give us worth and beauty. Because He has already done that, God has made us beautiful.
